Asylum

The law provides for asylum and/or withholding of removal for an alien if the individual can prove that he or she was persecuted or feared persecution in his or her home country based on his or her religion, political opinion, nationality, race or membership in a particular social group. An individual who fears torture may also qualify for relief. The persecution or fear of torture can be perpetrated by either the government of an individual's home country or by an organization that the government does not wish to or does not have the ability to control. An individual who wishes to seek asylum can do so by filing an application within one year after they arrive in the U.S., or, if they have been in the U.S. for over one year, within a reasonable timeframe if: 1) unforeseen circumstances significantly affected their eligibility or; 2) his or her ability to apply for asylum caused the postponement of filing the application.
