Mr. Noble's list of accomplishments at these nonprofit organizations is long. He, for example, restructured Family & Child Service of Schenectady's spending on a number of budget items so the organization can better serve its mission, and he led the organization in purchasing a building in Schenectady in 2011 to provide the charity with more space. He led Not So Common Players's incorporation process in 2009, which allowed it to operate independently from the Town of Clifton Park by the following year. At the Schenectady County Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, he formed the organization, secured its 501(c)(3) determination letter, and created and monitored its budget. He also secured a \$20,000 grant in 2008 to arm volunteer SPCA peace officers, acquire equipment, and purchase a police vehicle. "There are many charitable organizations in the community that want to do good but are structured in a way that impairs their ability to do so efficiently. I find myself fortunate to have worked with so many other board members who have been dedicated to eliminating these impediments, and I am honored to receive the Urbach Award," said Mr. Noble, who is a Colonie Central High School graduate and who received his bachelor's degree and master's degrees from the University at Albany. "I believe my work on these boards has helped their nonprofit organizations have a positive and lasting impact on the communities they serve." Mr. Noble's achievements at Tully Rinckey PLLC are equally impressive. As the member of Tully Rinckey PLLC's management team responsible for all financial aspects of the firm, he has managed its revenue growth that has led the firm to become one of the fastest growing law firms in the country as rated by inc5000. He laid the groundwork for Tully Rinckey PLLC's expansions into multiple markets in upstate New York, Virginia and the District of Columbia between 2008 and 2013.
