Under the SSA's definition for "disability," to qualify for SSDI benefits a worker "must not be able to engage in any substantial gainful activity (SGA) because of a medically-determinable physical or mental impairment(s): (1) that is expected to result in death, or (2) that has lasted or is expected to last for a continuous period of at least 12 months."
