

Veteran's Benefits

Veterans and their spouses who have low incomes may be eligible for a non-service connected benefit that could help them with long-term care matters. This benefit, referred to as the "Housebound Pension" or "Aid and Attendance Benefit," is available to veterans and their spouses when either one of them is at least 65 years old or is totally or permanently disabled. They must be in a nursing home, in assisted living, or homebound. Further, the veteran must have served at least 90 days on active duty and served at least one day in a qualified period of war. **How We Can Help**
